Lead Pastor's Annual Report - 2023

It's an important discipline to take time and look back and take in what God has done the past year and acknowledge and praise Him for the journey that we've taken. This year we added a song that helped us praise God with this truth: "I'm looking to Jesus, perfector of faith – my heart set on heaven where treasure awaits. I'll run with endurance to finish the race; I will trust in Christ every step I take." At the end of each leg of the race it is so good to take account of each step it took to get there and credit God with the endurance and strength to run the race he's laid before us. This year I have been reminded that God is never done working and moving. It isn't always dramatic, though sometimes it is, but it is often subtle shifts, adjustments, and nudges as we chase after the prize of faith. I'm encouraged to be a part of a community of believers who desire God to move and work in their lives and who seek to join God in where he is moving and working. It is a joy to chase God alongside those who sacrifice their time, talents, resources, celebrations, and more to join in him the journey. I have been so encouraged this year by the growth of the individual members of our church family and watching God move and work in each of your lives and to see you all join each other in what God is doing.

To begin this year, we surveyed some of the Apostle Paul's major thoughts that thread through his writings and thinking in the sermon series "Thinking Through Paul." After Easter and into the Summer over the course of two practical sermon series, we took a look at the image of God within men and how, out of that image, the lives of believers will be distinctly countercultural. In the Fall we returned to an exegetical series working through the book of Jude and finished the year with a December series on what it took to put Christmas together. Throughout the year we also had opportunities to be challenged by Pastor Jerry as he had occasion to share sermons that God laid on his heart and we were able to hear a message from Kurt Gomez as he and his family candidate for support for their missionary efforts in Mexico.

We continued to pursue relationships with our community, specifically to our daycare families. We've continued our "Belate Your Date" babysitting day to give our daycare parents a break and a few hours out. Due to scheduling we were unable to host our Christmas "Shopping Day" babysitting day, but that will return next year. I have continued, as opportunity allows, to take one morning on occasion to hand out free Tim Horton's coffee, courtesy of the church, to daycare parents as they drop off their kids before work. This year our 8th annual Block Party was able to reach, influence, and build relationships with over 200 people from the community and we were able to give away over \$1,200.00 in gift cards because of the generosity, sacrifice, and participation of our church family. We continue to welcome the local rabbit rescue, E.A.R.S., to use our facility for their holiday fundraisers as well as Lund Martial Arts to use our facility for their fundraisers and tournaments. We also were able to enjoy our Church Family Dinner Meetings and our Fellowship Sundays and utilize those times to invest in our church family relationships and focus on the journey we are each taking steps in.

God continues to bring more guests to Bethel. In 2023 we averaged 4 guests every Sunday. Of those guests, at least 54 were local first-time attenders. Around fifteen of those have become regular attenders. As I mentioned, God is always moving and this year he moved 7 of our brothers and sisters in Christ to make their faith public through baptism! As always, Pastor Jerry's Care ministry is invaluable in our guest connections and continued relationships.

This year we've been offering two youth groups to our students and both have been great for their growth and relationships with each other, the church, and God. We have 8-12 teens meet every other Sunday evening for our FUSE Youth Group and spent the year studying the biblical concept of wisdom and how it practically applies in our lives. We also have 10-12 older elementary kids meet on the first Sunday of the month, after church, for our 213 Youth Group. We have spent this year teaching and investing in understanding Salvation. I have appreciated the help of the volunteers who join me in those ministries: Dan and Sam Eberlin, Katie George, and Tyler and Hannah Zesiger.

On a personal note, I have finished my 18th course in the pursuit of my Master of Divinity through the Rawlins School of Divinity at Liberty University Online. I have 7 classes remaining in the degree, am halfway through the fifth semester of a six-semester course plan. I continue to maintain my 4.0 gpa. I appreciate the church's support and sacrifice to help me pursue this educational opportunity.

With every step of 2023, God has been faithful, and God has moved and is still moving. I look forward to joining him in what he is doing in your lives and the church in 2024 and am so grateful to God and to you all for the privilege to play a role in his plans for each of you.

Bethel CARES Ministry

2023 ANNUAL REPORT Bethel Baptist Church

We have completed another year, and I am beginning to think about 2024. This past year has brought contrasts compared to previous years, when we experienced so many issues related to the pandemic. But God has given us many positive areas of ministry which encourage all of us of His presence in our efforts here at Bethel. We in leadership are enthused about what God has done here and what He may do through us in the New Year.

CARE treated our shut-ins with fruit baskets and Christmas literature, which was designed to offer them encouragement for the holidays last year. We are primed to continue the tradition in a few weeks. During the year, I visited those from our church, others who were patients, in the hospital, and those in retirement communities and private homes. My goal was to encourage them, but in reality, I was the beneficiary of the visit. I conducted 11 funerals this year from our church and from families in our community. I have had a tremendous opportunity to minister to several families, who had needs. Our major outreach campaign came about, as we organized a mailing to the community. We mailed a flyer designed locally to 2,500 homes. We heard from some recipients who let me know that they were glad to learn of our church and the many faces of ministry for the family. I have taught a Membership Class, and have recently added more Bible material to the curriculum to create a combined discipleship and membership study. We started with 11 students, and from this class will come new members of our church. Six adults have been baptized recently, with several of them attending this class.

For most of this year we welcome visitors to our worship services nearly every Sunday. We have a staff of greeters, who work together to make every attender feel welcome. Many of those who visit are returning, and many are getting involved in our ministry. These visitors are all contacted when they utilize our Communication Card. I reach out to each visitor to offer our CARE program and encourage them to return. Another tool that we have recently started using is the church van. It goes out every Sunday morning as needed, and is operated by two teams of Bethel workers who pick up folks who want to attend and who need transportation.

I am pleased that after 6 years as the CARE pastor, we are seeing some positive moves in the lives of many of our Bethel family. Pastor Tim and I work as a team, as we strive to meet needs of our church family and offer assistance to those who have concerns. I deeply appreciate the spirit of our church family, who support CARE and work with others and myself to keep the ministry going. A big event that has highlighted our fall and Thanksgiving season was our program called "Food for Friends". We teamed up with EUMA here in Erie, and our church provided enough non-perishable food for 80 families. We worked together as a church family to box food, and EUMA distributed the packed boxes to the families they are serving. It was a blessing to our church to be able to reach out with food, including materials sharing the Gospel.

So, what's next is the question I ask myself this time each year. In looking back at the past year I have seen how God has blessed, and I contemplate another year with His guidance.. Then I anticipate what God will do to make the New Year a blessing to others including a plan to reach lost souls. I will have ideas along the way, and I appreciate sharing with those who wish to be a part of what we're doing. I strongly believe in communication, so if you have any ideas or suggestions, please let me know.

May God bless you and help me to develop His work here at Bethel. As John McArthur once said: "Enter the coming year with renewed hope in the power of God to do through you what you cannot."



We currently have 171 students and are on track to again meet all budgetary goals for the 2023-2024 school year. Please join me in praying for the spiritual health of our student body so that God will continue to move within their hearts. Pray for enrollment for the 2024-2025 school year, for the leadership team, and for the Bethel Christian School Board as we tackle the issue of classroom space in a growing school.

Lastly please join in praising God for 50 successful years in the Erie Community. God continues to work at Bethel everyday, through our teachers and daycare staff we are sharing the good news of Christ to over 230 students and 160 families.
